A Black History Moment

On June 4, 1776, the Declaration of Independence was signed, marking the colonists' independence from Great Britain. But some seventy-five years later, some black Americans were not ready to celebrate. Abolitionist movement leader Frederick Douglass, in 1852, gave a scathing speech the day after Independence Day, "This Fourth of July is yours, not mine. You may rejoice, I must mourn... ". Douglass reminded listeners that when the Declaration of Independence was signed, many blacks were still slaves. Even the British were more likely to offer freedom to blacks than the colonists. Just because we were set free in 1865, does not mean we should retroactively wipe away past incidents clean. We can only celebrate the positive events from 1865 onward, and those who stood the test of time.

As Christians, let us remember the countless blessings that God has shown for all of His people down through
