**A Moment in Black History Tribe of Issachar**

**Gerald Anderson "Jerry" Lawson** (December 1, 1940 – April 9, 2011) was an African American electronic engineer known for his work in designing the Fairchild Channel F video game console. Mr. Lawson was the first person to make it possible to play a variety of video games at home. In the mid-1970s, Mr. Lawson was the director of engineering and marketing for the newly formed video game division of Fairchild Semiconductor. It was under his direction that the division brought to market in 1976 the Fairchild Channel F, a home console that allowed users to play different games contained on removable cartridges. Until then, home video game systems could play games that were built into the machines themselves.

In March 2011, Mr. Lawson was honored for his innovative work by the International Game Developers Association, an overdue acknowledgment for an unfamiliar contributor to the technological transformation that has changed how people live and created an international business. One month later, he died of complications from diabetes.

Lawson was one of two black members of the Homebrew Computer Club, a group of early computer hobbyists which would produce a number of industry leaders including Steve Jobs and Steve Wozniak, the founders of Apple.

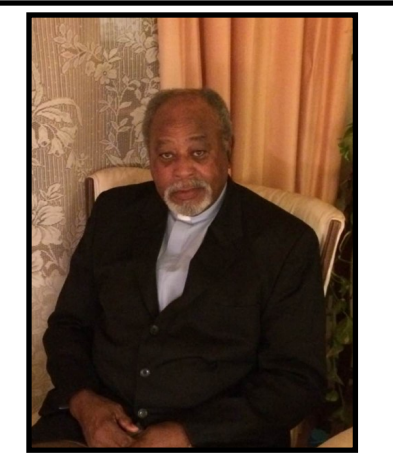
When we think about the word walk, the first thing that comes to our minds is putting one foot in front of another. However, walk

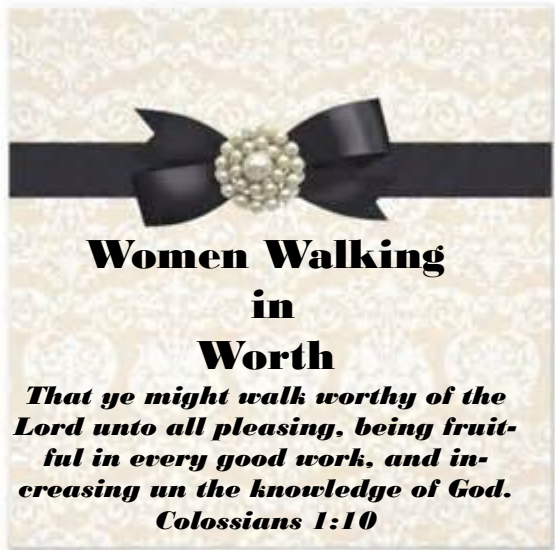

Proverbs 3:11-12 says, "My son, despise not the chastening of the Lord; neither be weary of his correction: For whom the Lord loveth he correcteth; even as a father the son in whom he delighteth."
